Adjudicator: Jonathan Rea

Jonathan studied music at Cambridge, where he sang in the University Chamber Choir and studied piano with Peter Pettinger. He held choral and instrumental awards and won the Rima Alamuddin prize for piano performance. In the Queen's Birthday Honours List in 2020, Jonathan was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to Music in Northern Ireland.

After 10 happy years as Director of Music in Bangor Grammar School, he began a broader career in conducting, producing, writing, composing, arranging and piano accompanying. He has conducted many programmes for BBC Songs of Praise and directed the Belfast choir for Children in Need. For several years he was the Principal Examiner for A-Level Music Performance in Northern Ireland. He is the choral director for the annual Sing! conference in Nashville, for whom he has on two occasions directed choirs with 1000 participants. He now provides consultancy to a number of church-based organisations.

Jonathan is Creative Director and Chief Executive of New Irish Arts, whose choir, orchestra and youth choir perform at over 20 events per year. They have sold out Belfast's Waterfront Hall on numerous occasions, and often have over 250 participants in their larger concerts. Jonathan is increasingly in demand as a writer and speaker, occasionally contributing to programmes like Radio 4's Prayer for the Day and Morning Service.

General Conditions

- 1. Competitors in Classes 1-7 must use the Official Accompanist.
- 2. If the Official Accompanist is required for any 'Own Choice' competition, the Secretary must be notified at time of entry so that the Accompanist can be booked. Piano accompaniment for Instrumental Classes should be sent to Jonathan Beatty by 16th February 2024.
- 3. All Own Choice music provided for the accompanist should be clearly labelled Fermanagh Feis with the Competitor's name and Class Number. A contact telephone number must be provided with the music.
- 4. The Feis Committee will not be responsible for any missing music.

<u>This date</u> is to allow for the submission of the poems to the adjudicator, allowing her adequate time to adjudicate the poems. Winning entries will be announced to schools prior to first week in March 2024. A special Prizegiving event for the Own Poetry winners will take place in St. Michael's College. Schools will be notified to share the invite to parents and winning pupils to come to this event.

Entries should be listed on official entry form. This is to ensure pupils' names will be included in the Feis Programme.

The poem should be written on one side of A4 sheet and should not be mounted. Competition Class No. should be written on the top right-hand corner of the front sheet. Competitor's name and school should be written on the back. Each poem should be signed by Teacher stating that it is unaided work. **N.B. Poems will not be returned.**

Mrs. Irene Burke MA (Drama) HDE LTCL Drama and Education are Irene's two great passions in life. Over the past 30 years, she has taught Communication Skills and Speech and Drama, ranging from primary through to third level. A Senior Examiner with The Leinster School of Music and Drama, She has been responsible for the production and direction of over 30 full-scale school musicals, involving casts of over 100 students on stage and 35 backstage. Some years ago, she returned to UCD and was awarded an M.A. (Hons) in Modern Drama Studies- making a particular study of the plays of Frank McGuinness. Irene is a very experienced adjudicator having performed this role at numerous Poetry and Drama Festivals both North and South. She has a strong belief that performing in these festivals helps our students develop confidence together with communication and presentation skills.

Conditions:

1. Bursaries, trophies and medals will be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator.

- 2. Competitors may not enter more than one monologue, duologue or scene.
- 3. A copy of 'own choice' scripts must be made available to the adjudicator on the day
- and, in the case of acted scenes, the day before the performance.
- 4. Competitors will receive a card indicating the date and time of the competition.
- 5. Persons making entries are advised to read the rules at the front of the syllabus.
- 6. All entries must be on official entry forms and accompanied by appropriate fee.
- Cheques should be made payable to Feis Fermanagh.

Competitors are advised to pay close attention to the time limits in each class ,

at the adjudicator's discretion, marks will be de-ducted for running over time or competitors may be asked to stop and will be judged on their performance thus far.

ACTED SCENE

Brief: Competitors' choice of script. One-act play or small portion of scene. No less than 3 performers as this defines an ensemble, Setting-up time limited to 5 minutes. Entry fee: £10 / E12

Class 1: Primary pupils acted scene (confined)

Confined to competitors not prepared by specialist Speech & Drama teachers or companies. *Can include the use of song and dance if it is part of the script*. Strict time limit: 20 minutes

Class 2 : Primary pupils acted scene (open)

Open competition to all. All abilities and competitors. Can include students prepared by specialist Speech & Drama teachers or companies. *Can include the use of song and dance if it is part of the script*. Strict time limit: 20 minutes

Class 3: Yrs. 8/9/10 acted scene (open)

Open competition. All abilities and competitors. Can include students prepared by specialist Speech & Drama teachers, drama clubs, glee clubs or companies. *Can include the use of song and dance if it is part of the script*.

Strict time limit: 20 minutes

Class 4: Yr. 11+ acted scene (open)

Open competition. All abilities and competitors. Can include students prepared by specialist Speech & Drama teachers, drama clubs, glee clubs or companies. *Can include the use of song and dance if it is part of the script*.

Strict time limit: 30 minutes

Class 5: Yr. 11+ Improvised or devised drama (open)

Open competition. All abilities and competitors. Can include students prepared by specialist Speech & Drama teachers, drama clubs, glee clubs or companies. *Can include the use of song and dance if it is part of the script*. Can also include devised GCSE works or A-level works. Strict time limit:15 minutes

MUSICAL THEATRE (open to all abilities and competitors)

Open Competition section. Competitors to perform a scene into song from musical theatre works. It should combine acting, singing and movement to gesture to tell the story. This section is brand new in its

conception however some elements have been taken from and has replaced the previous "Vocal Solo Songs from the Shows" The material must come from Musicals, Musical films, or Music in Theatre works. Overall presentation and appropriate use of props will be taken into consideration.

Scene into Song

Brief: Competitors should speak in character for a minimum of 30 seconds and a maximum of 2 mins. The song should ideally be in and around 4 minutes approx however these timings can vary according to class and materials needs. Competitors are to use their own backing tracks plugged into the stage sound system. And pre agree all musical cues with stage hands before the performance begins. The material must come from Musicals, Musical films, or Music in Theatre works. Overall presentation and appropriate use of props will be taken into consideration.
